

APA (American Psychological Association) 7th is an author-date referencing style where you have an in-text citation and a related entry in a reference list at the end of your document.

## APA 7th - social media

This example specifies the method of referencing posts to social networks such as Blogs, Facebook and Twitter.

If there is no year of publication use the abbreviation (n.d.) for no date and include a retrieval date.

---

### Reference list

Add a reference list entitled **References** at the end of your essay, citing all sources used in the body of your writing, except for personal communications.

The reference list should be in alphabetical order by the first author's surname (last name).

The first line of each reference should be aligned with the left margin. Second and subsequent lines should be indented seven spaces (1.27cm).

#### **Blog post**

##### **Format**

Author. (Year, Date). Title of post. *Name of Site* . <https://xxx>

**Note:** Blog posts are treated more like an article in a journal.

## **Facebook**

**Note:** For the title of the post use up to the first 20 words of the content. After the title in square brackets describe any audiovisuals e.g., [Image attached], [Infographic] or [Video].

### **Format**

Author. (Year, Date). *Title of post* [Description of audiovisuals]. Site Name. <https://xxx>

### **Example**

## **Twitter / Tweet**

**Note:** For the title of the post use up to the first 20 words of the content. After the title in square brackets describe any audiovisuals e.g., [Image attached] or [Thumbnail with link attached].

### **Format**

Author [@username]. (Year, Date). *Title of post* [Description of audiovisuals]. Site Name. <https://xxx>

### **Example**

## In-text citation

When you use another person's ideas or words in your text include the author's name and publication date in brackets.

If you use the author's name as part of a sentence, include the date of publication in brackets.

If there is no year of publication use the abbreviation (n.d.) for no date.

- Reflects on issues as a mother and in particular reading and interpreting children's books with an adult mindset (No Mum is an Island, 2012).
- Kepnes (2017) ponders on the changes to the Lonely Planet guide with the change of ownership.

## Quoting

Direct quotes of less than 40 words require quotation marks and the page number/s.

For direct quotations, where page numbers are not available, use a paragraph number, or if a large document use a section heading followed by the paragraph number.

## Paragraph numbers

**Note:** If there are no paragraph numbers, count the paragraphs. Use para. in front of the number

- The differences of reading books as a child "don't quite retain that same magic upon rereading as an adult" (No Mum is an Island, 2012, para. 1).
- Kepnes (2017) discusses how Lonely Planet has "fallen from its perch as "the bible" for budget travellers (para. 6).

## Section headings

**Note:** Add the word section after the heading. If it is a long heading shorten it and put quotation marks around the heading

- Bolstad (2017) stated that "staff have worked together to develop a shared values base to underpin curriculum thinking" (A values-based curriculum section, para. 1).
